THE PLAY

Two nerve-wracked men without any tea lying on beds. They are trying to distract themselves from the sinister job which awaits them. They think they are alone but suddenly the dumb waiter comes down with impossible instructions. Who is upstairs?

Written in 1957, yet still completely relevant to the world of today, <u>The Dumb Waiter</u> is a one-act play, at times hilarious, at others disquieting. Are these powerless characters reflections of ourselves?

THE AUTHOR

Nobel-prize winner Harold Pinter is one of the most influential playwrights of modern times. Actor, director and playwright, some of his plays include <u>The Homecoming</u> and <u>The Birthday Party</u>, with many being adapted for film. He died in 2008.

THIS PRODUCTION

Sporting a young international cast, this Line Theatre production will be touring small venues around Ireland in June 2018. The cast became acquainted with each other through an Irish theatre company, Crooked House Theatre based in Newbridge, County Kildare. The desire to create their own project during their Irish stay led them to rediscover this successful play.
